


Just Enough for Me



The next day, Nathan arrived at school and sat next to Katie. He took a bright red crayon out of the box they were sharing and began coloring his dinosaur.

“That was fun, Mrs. Bella!” said Nathan. “I’ll miss you after today. Two days of kindergarten are just enough for me!”







Nathan thought, If I have to return my dinosaur book next week, how can this be my last day of kindergarten?


