

Exciting news! I won my age group at my last competition! I think I skied better than I have all season.

I do not have any siblings. Both of my parents ski. Before I started competing, I would ski with them a lot.

Competitions are a lot of waiting as you get two runs every three hours. I usually free-ski between runs with friends. One run in a competition takes about 20-30 seconds. In mogul competitions, I am judged on turns, speed, and jumps. Some of the best tricks are the Kossack (you spread your legs and put your polls between your legs), and a 360 (spinning all the way around). I do meet kids from other clubs.

We practice jumps on roller skates because roller skis are much heavier than roller skates. We practice indoors at Woodward at Copper Mountain during the summer and early winter.

I take breaks from skiing in the summer, but I also go to a few camps, one in Canada and another one at Mount Hood. I do not train on Mondays and Thursdays during the winter months.
